## **Starting points for first-year students**

### **Center for Art & Media**

#### Studio Art

All Studio Art majors and minors must take ART 127 and choose either ART 102 or ART 114.

- ART 102 <u>Visual Thinking</u> This course is highly recommended for students intending to major in Studio Art and interested in photography and mixed media.
- ART 114 <u>Draw I: Intro Mat & Methods</u> This course is highly recommended for students intending to major in Studio Art and interested in painting.
- ART 127 <u>Object Context Mean: Fundamentals 3-D</u> This course is required for all majors and minors in Studio Art.
- ART 259.001 <u>Topic: Mixed Media</u> Using a combination of materials, object, and processes students will create an expressive version of their artistic vision. Some of the possibilities include digitally generated imagery, found or collected objects, appropriated images, and traditional art materials. Appropriate for beginning level art students.
- ART 259.002 <u>Topic: Seeing Color & Race</u> This course focuses on the phenomena of color and its role and importance in culture and language. Appropriate for beginning level art students; activities include printmaking techniques.

- DAN 135 <u>Dance Seminar</u> Intended dance majors should take this course spring semester of their first year.
- DAN 201 <u>Intermediate Pointe</u> (by placement) This course is recommended for students interested in advancing their pointe work and registration in one pointe class is required for dancers auditioning for a ballet residency.
- DAN 233 <u>Africanist Dance Technique II</u>- (by placement) It is highly recommended that students intending to major in dance take at least 2 technique classes a semester.
- DAN 238 <u>Dance Technologies</u> This course is recommended for students intending to major in dance. Should be taken sophomore year or earlier.
- DAN 301 <u>Advanced Pointe and Variations</u> (by placement) This course is recommended for students interested in advancing their pointe work and registration in one pointe class is required for dancers auditioning for a ballet residency.
